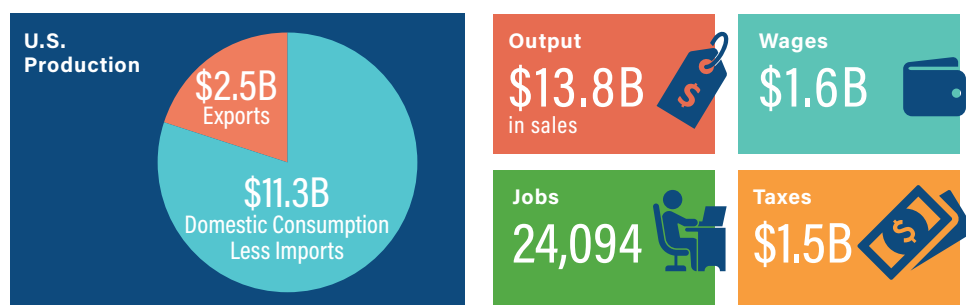


High Impact Economic Contribution

Industries That Rely on Healthy Animals

Animal Production

Ranches, farms, and feedlots that raise, feed, or keep animals for eventual sale or food production.

Veterinary Services

Veterinary services include routine and emergency care for companion and food-producing animals. Veterinarians and their staff diagnosis diseases, administer vaccines, prescribe treatment, and perform surgeries.

Meat and Dairy Production

Meat and dairy production include businesses that process and package meat and dairy products.

Pet Services

Pet services include groomers, boarding facilities, and animal trainers for domestic pets or service animals.
